

Rocky Mountain House Council highlights from the Sept. 11, 2018 meeting

Policing committee bylaw 2018/26V

Council passed third and final reading of Bylaw 2018-26V to establish a policing committee and adopted the related Police Committee Policy Manual (Policy 007-2018).

Under the Alberta Police Act, the Town is responsible for having its own municipal police force. The Town meets this obligation by contracting the RCMP through a Municipal Police Service Agreement.

The Police Act also provides for towns to implement police committees where the RCMP serves as the municipal police force. Council recognizes the importance of public members on the committee and will be seeking applications from Town residents to fill three public positions this fall.

Strategic Planning and Service Level Review

Councillors have scheduled a three-day strategic planning, priorities and service level review session for Nov. 2 through 4, ahead of the 2019 budget deliberations.

Subdivision and Development Bylaws

Councillors passed the following updated subdivision and development bylaws to bring them into conformance with the new Municipal Government Act:

- Subdivision and Development Authority Bylaw 2018/22V.
- Subdivision and Development Appeal Board Bylaw 2018/23V.
- Subdivision and Development Appeal Board Clerk Bylaw 2018/24V.

The Municipal Planning Commission (MPC) structure was also reviewed for best practices. Councillors reduced the membership to five from seven, maintaining three public members and two council members.
