Setting priorities for the next five-years

The 2017 Recreation Master Plan is a ten-year plan completed to guide Rocky Mountain House region's allocation of services and overcome challenges identified by the community in the parks and recreation system.

The Plan sets out recommendations for indoor & outdoor facilities as well as programs.

Significant Facility Updates since 2017

In the past five years, significant facility updates have been completed. Considering this and shifts in community priorities the Recreation, Parks, and Community Services Board engaged the community via s survey to update the recommendations established in the 2017 Recreation Master Plan.
