

Public Rules and Code of Conduct – Rocky Regional Recreation Centre

The Town of Rocky Mountain House is committed to creating a safe and comfortable environment for all those who use our facilities. Guests, athletes, players and fans can expect an environment in which they will be treated in a consistent, professional and courteous manner by staff and others using the centre. Below is an outline of our rules and code of conduct.

Public Code of Conduct

- Fans are entitled to enjoy the sporting experience free from disruptive or inconsiderate behaviors or unruly actions
- Fans may not interfere with the event and/or athletes in any manner
- Fans shall refrain from using abusive language or obscene gestures
- Fans may not engage in fighting, throwing objects or other behavior deemed detrimental to the
 experience of other guests and those who engage in any of these actions will immediately be
 asked to leave the centre
- Fans are encouraged to report inappropriate behavior to staff
- Fans shall comply with requests from staff regarding operational and emergency procedures

General Rules

- Disorderly conduct, inappropriate behavior, abuse of the centre, equipment, or staff and/or disregard for rules may result in immediate dismissal from the centre.
- No bikes, skateboards, rollerblades, scooters and heelies are permitted in the building.
- Children/Youth under the age of 10 must be accompanied by a guardian at all times.
- Pets with the exception of service animals are not permitted in the centre.
- Elevator use is only for those who require assistance.
- Smoking, vaping, consumption of cannabis or alcohol is not permitted within the facility or within 5 metres of any entrance doors.

Public Skate Rules

- CSA approved helmets with working chin strap required for anyone under the age of 18.
- Skates or ice cleats must be worn by all participants on the ice surface.
- Only CSA approved Skating Assists devices are permitted.
- No strollers allowed. Sleds may be permitted, but children in sleds must be wearing helmets and sleds must be used on ice appropriately.
- No skaters permitted on ice until Zamboni has exited the ice and gates are closed.
- No sticks or pucks are permitted.
- Skate Guards must be worn on skates in the main lobby or any surface without skate tile.

Shinny Rules

- CSA approved hockey helmets with working chin strap required for all players, 18 and under require full face mask.
- Slapshots and body checks are not permitted.
- Skate Guards must be worn on skates in the main lobby or any surface without skate tile.
- Players must be 12 years of age or older.

School Groups Rules

- CSA approved helmets with working chin strap required for anyone under the age of 18.
- Elementary Schools are required to provide supervision at a ratio of 8 to 1.
- Student supervisor / teacher if on ice must have skates or cleats on.
- Skates or cleats must be worn by all participants on the ice surface (exception being broomball).
- Only CSA approved Skating Assists devices are permitted.
- No strollers or sleds are permitted.
- Skate Guards must be worn on skates in the main lobby or any surface without skate tile.
- No access to score clock or music system.

Private Ice Rentals and Community Groups

(Including Minor Hockey, Rec Hockey, Speed Skating & Figure Skating Clubs)

- Skates or ice cleats must be worn by all participants on the ice surface. This includes instructors, coaches and parents.
- Skate Guards must be worn on skates in the main lobby or any surface without skate tile.
- Coaches must ensure change rooms are left in an acceptable condition free of damage before returning the dressing room key.
- Change room keys may only be signed out by the coaches or managers.
- Teams are expected to vacate their dressing rooms 30 minutes after the conclusion of their
- rental time.
- Change rooms are available 1 Hour prior to the time ice is booked.
- Refrain from taking to the ice until staff are off the ice and gates are closed.

Drop-in Sports

Lacrosse, Basketball, Ball Hockey

- No slam dunking during basketball, nets will not be lowered.
- CSA approved helmets with face mask required for players 18 and under for Ball Hockey & Lacrosse.
- Children 10 & under need a parent/guardian in the building.
- Lacrosse balls need to remain in bag until on the field surface.
