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Budget 2020

The Town of Rocky Mountain House has approved its [2020 operating and capital budgets](#), totaling \$31,942,973. For the second year in a row, the Town of Rocky Mountain House will not increase its municipal taxation revenue.

Fees and Rates Bylaw 2020/01

Rocky Mountain House Town Council adopted [Fees and Rates Bylaw 2020/01](#), which consolidates all municipal service fees into one bylaw.

Council adopted Taxi Bylaw 2020/02. This bylaw meets the Town's legal requirements for regulating taxis within the municipality, and clarifies the appeal process and driver and owner responsibilities.
