Regional Governance Study – Final Report

Council reviewed the final report from the regional governance study, conducted April through August this year. The study found that the Town and County are both viable as an individual municipality. The Town has a more favourable assessment split between residential and non-residential properties than the average for Towns in Alberta, and has also used just 16 per cent of its allowable debt limit. The provincial Town average is 32 per cent.

The report also made recommendations for the Village of Caroline and Clearwater County. Each municipality may choose to move forward with the recommendations as they see fit.

Rocky Mountain House Council accepted the study as presented.
