



UTILITIES IMPLEMENTING PAPER BILL FEE

Starting July 2026, a \$2.00 fee will be added to all paper utility bills.

Producing and mailing paper utility bills is a significant cost. Utility customers who choose to receive a paper bill will be charged a fee to cover these costs starting on their July utility bill.

The printing and mailing costs were previously included in the utility rates. By shifting how we recover these costs, the Town of Rocky Mountain House can help keep overall rate increases as low as possible.

To continue to receive bills for free, utility customers can change their billing preference from paper to email.

HELP US TACKLE POTHOLES THIS SEASON



Pothole season is here! Crews will be out repairing potholes on Town roads, but we rely on your eyes in the community. If you come across a pothole, report it through the "Report a Concern" tool at rockymtnhouse.com/p/potholes.

BLACK KNOT

Black Knot is a contagious tree disease that is caused by an airborne fungus. It infects trees and shrubs within the Prunus and Rose families and spreads by wind and birds. If left untreated it effectively strangles new growth and dooms the tree to deterioration.

It is important to monitor your trees for Black Knot symptoms. It is easiest to identify between late fall and early spring when dormant and branches are bare.

Early detection and sterile pruning is the most effective way of dealing with Black Knot. Prune knots by cutting back at least 15-20 cm below the swelling. Disinfect pruning tools afterwards.

Burn diseased material immediately or put infected branches in a sealed garbage bag and put in your black waste cart. Even after the knots have been removed from the tree, they can produce infected spores for up to 4 months after removal. Do not mix infected cuttings with organic materials in your green cart.
