Old Town Water & Sewer Rehabilitation and Municipal Stimulus Program funding

Town of Rocky Mountain House will replace a section of water and sewer infrastructure in Old Town along Hwy. 752 (63 St.) The area has recorded 11 watermain rust holes and one beam break in the past four years.

Council approved the \$852,531 project as part of the 2020 capital budget year; however, \$788,696 will be funded by Rocky's allotment of the Municipal Stimulus Program (MSP). The balance of \$63,835 will come from the Water and Sewer Reserve.

Helen Hunley Park Area

Council reviewed details of the Helen Hunley Park area and the various amenities in that space: The Rocky Museum, the Rocky Chamber, the Visitors Information Centre, the Lou Soppit Community Centre, the W. Helen Hunley Memorial Park, the new spray park, the skate park, the walking trail and sani-dump/RV potable water filling station. While the area is at maximum capacity for uses, current parking is sufficient and the Town recently accommodated the museum's request to expand its outdoor display area.

Council instructed Administration to monitor the functionality of the area through 2021, and consider installing water meters at the sani-dump potable water filling station to better gauge the cost of providing that service.

Other items of note:

Council approved an updated <u>Tangible Capital Assets policy</u>, which outlines the procedure for maintaining and managing the tangible capital assets based on Public Sector Accounting guidelines. The original policy was implemented in 2007.

Council welcomed a delegation from the Rocky Medical Clinic to discuss the lease arrangement for that building. The clinic building is jointly owned by the Town of Rocky Mountain House and Clearwater County; Council instructed Administration to consult with Clearwater County on the clinic's request.
