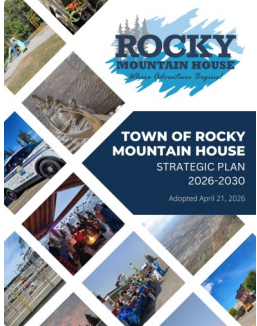




TOWN COUNCIL INTRODUCES STRATEGIC PLAN 2026-2030



Council has formally adopted a new Strategic Plan that will guide the Town's priorities and decision-making over the coming years.

Developed through thoughtful discussion and community input, the plan clearly defines Council's key community values and identifies the areas of focus that will shape programs, services and long-term planning.

The Strategic Plan 2026-2030 provides a shared vision for Council, administration and residents as we work together to build a caring, cohesive and desirable community for all.

Council has set five priorities for ourselves. Over the next four years, we will focus on:

- Serviced, shovel-ready land for residential, commercial and industrial uses.
- Positioning for Phase 1 of a new multiplex.
- Housing for all now, and in the future.
- Steady infrastructure maintenance of pipes, roads and treatment plants.
- Improved positive social sentiment.

These are lofty goals, but we believe, with your support, we can make it happen.

This Strategic Plan is based on four simple but important ideas: making sure Rocky Mountain House is a good place to earn a living; that it is a great place to live; keeping myself and my fellow councillors accountable to the people who elected us; and making sure the Town as a corporate entity is around for the generations still to come.

This plan is about finding that balance. We want to grow, in a way that makes sense for our Town and for the people who call it home. We want to protect what is good, improve what needs work, and build a future that gives the next generation every reason to stay, work, and raise a family here.

NO MOW MAY



Allow your grass to grow during the month of May, creating habitat and forage for early season pollinators.

No Mow May is a campaign encouraging people to refrain from mowing their lawns for the month of May. The goal is to allow wildflowers and other wild plants to grow, providing an early boost for pollinators like bees and butterflies. This helps create more diverse habitats and supports the overall health of local ecosystems.

PAPER UTILITY BILL FEE

Starting July 2026, a \$2.00 fee will be added to paper utility bills.
